Facts About OSU

Oregon State University is the land-grant university for the State of Oregon. It began as an academy called Corvallis College in the 1850's, became a liberal arts college in 1865, began to receive state support in 1868, and graduated its first class in 1870.

Today it has a main campus of 432 acres and many thousands of acres of forest and farm lands for research and teaching, both adjacent to the campus and in several parts of the state.

The student body numbers more than 12,000; the faculty—many of whom teach only part time—numbers more than 1,500.

The facilities for physical education, outdoor recreation, and intercollegiate athletics are especially well planned and well located, with fields for intramural sports and recreation close to the center of the campus and to the residence halls. The Coliseum can seat 10,500 for a basket-ball-game and more than that for other occasions when the main floor is used for seating. The Stadium can seat 32,000.

The Horner Müseum, on the lower floor of the Coliseum, has attractive exhibits of local, national, and international significance. Wildlife exhibits in this Museum and in the Natural History Museum of the Zoology Department provide lifelike displays of birds and animals.

Rapidly expanding research facilities provide excellent opportunities for experimental work by faculty and graduate students, and to some extent for undergraduates. The Forestry Sciences Laboratory, the new Oceanography Building, the new Radiation Laboratory, the Water Laboratory, and the Marine Science Laboratory at Newport all have been made possible through grants from the Federal Government.
